### WAYNE STATE (14-32 Overall, 10-18 GLIAC)

#### Wayne State concludes 2002 campaign

The Wayne State University baseball team completed its 2002 season with a pair of losses to visiting Hillsdale College. The Warriors end the year with a 14-32 overall record with a GLIAC mark of 10-18.

#### Wayne State University Head Coach Rodger George

Rodger George, the seventh head coach in the 62-year history of baseball at Wayne State University, completed his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach. His record in 14 years at WSU stands at 272-371-11, while his all-time collegiate coaching record, including eight years at Henry Ford Community College, is 469-512-13. George is tied with Joseph E. Truske (1946-59) for the longest tenure as a Wayne State baseball coach.

#### Assistant Coaches

Associate head coach Jay Alexander completed his fourth season as associate head coach and seventh year as a member of the WSU coaching staff. Pitching coach Dave Marcon concluded his third season as a member of Rod George's staff. Robert Wilson was a first-year volunteer coach.

#### Last Week for Wayne State

The Warriors GLIAC doubleheader scheduled for May 8 at Findlay was cancelled due to inclement weather. Wayne State lost a 25-10 non-conference game at Eastern Michigan on May 9. WSU split a league twinbill on May 10 versus Hillsdale. The Warriors won the opener 8-7, but fell 9-3 in the nightcap. HC won both games on Saturday, 8-0 and 5-4.

The Warriors scored seven times in the first inning off EMU starter Ryan Ford, but the Eagles would battle back scoring once in the first and eight times in the second to knock WSU starter Rick Okis from the game. EMU added a single run in the third and seven more in the fourth.

Wayne State was out-hit just 19-17 in the game, but Eagle batters smacked five home runs including two by Derrick Peterson, who finished the game with six RBI.

Frank Jeney led the Warrior offensive attack with four hits including two doubles and a triple. Bobby Marten had three singles while Ryan Chapp and Tim Baywal each had two hits. Baywal had a double and drove in three runs.

WSU's pitching corps walked 13 batters, hit two more and threw three wild pitches. Eric Biehl replaced Okis in the second inning. Paul Gergics hurled 2/3 of an inning, while freshman Gary Zielke pitched two innings. Adam Stacey allowed one unearned run in two innings of work.

In Friday's opener, the Warriors rallied for four runs in the bottom of the sixth for the win. The Chargers won the nightcap as WSU left 11 runners on base.

In the first game, HC scored five times in the third inning but the Warriors responded with four runs in the fourth and added four more in the sixth. Hillsdale had runners at first and second with one out after scoring once in the seventh but Chris Lattig's line drive was snared by Frank Jeney at third, who completed the double play by nailing the runner at first.

Jeney had two hits in the contest, while Tim Baywal drove in two runs with a triple in the sixth. Paul Gergics earned his first WSU victory in relief of Baywal. Gergics allowed two runs (one earned) in four innings.

In Friday's second game, Hillsdale scored twice in both the first and third innings and sealed the win with a five-run fourth. The Warriors out-hit the guests, 10-9, but stranded 11 runners. Bobby Marten went three-for-four, with Ron Kochan recording two hits including a triple.

Wayne State's first two pitchers allowed nine runs in 3.2 inning but relievers Ty Stevenson and Adam Stacey shut the door over the final 3.1 innings.

In Saturday's first contest, Hillsdale starter Marcus Harris limited WSU to two singles (by Ron Kochan and Tim Baywal) and only one Warrior runner reached third base.

Jeff Biehl made his first collegiate start and allowed six runs (five earned) in one-plus innings. Ty Stevenson hurled the next three innings and did not allow a run. Sean Barclay pitched the fourth and fifth innings surrendering two earned runs. Adam Stacey retired three of the four batters he faced in the seventh.

In the final game of the season, Hillsdale scored twice in the top of the first, but the Warriors tied it with a pair of runs in their half of the inning. The Chargers scored twice more in the third inning for a 4-2 advantage. Once again, Wayne State battled back with two runs in the fifth inning.

The Chargers scored the game-winning run in the seventh inning. Two singles and a fielder's choice loaded the bases. After a fly out, Ben Rush walked on a 3-1 pitch. HC almost added another run when the next batter flied out to center field, but Jason Bowers was called out on an appeal for leaving third base to soon.

Tim Baywal drove in two runs, while Ron Kochan added a triple.

WSU starter Gary Zielke hurled the first three innings allowing four runs (two earned). Paul Gergics pitched the final four innings and gave up just one run.

### Warrior Team Notes

The season was a tale of two years. The Warriors were 11-12 overall and 7-2 in the league after the first 23 games. In the final 23 contests, WSU went 3-20 overall and 3-16 in the conference.

The Warriors were 11-7 in games decided by one or two runs.

Wayne State went 1-11 against the three GLIAC teams that qualified for the NCAA Regionals.

### Warrior Player Notes

Center fielder Ron Kochan led the squad in batting average (.386), on-base percentage (.441), multiple-hit games (14) and fielding percentage (1.000 - 80 chances).

Mark Davis had team-highs in triples (4), home runs (5), and slugging percentage (.515).

Sophomore Tim Baywal led in RBI (23) and multiple-RBI games (6), while freshman Bobby Marten led the team in walks (21) and finished the year with more walks than strikeouts (16).

Ryan Woodard had a team-best four victories, while Terry Miller led the team in starts (9), innings (46.1) and opponent batting average (.261).
