## The Number 35 Award

## WSU adopts new athletic identity

Wayne State University, by recommendation of a universitywide task force, has adopted a new athletic identity system. The new system replaces a limited and dated identification system and introduces the Warrior team name and mascot.

The previous name, Tartar, first appeared in 1927 after a contest held on the then — City College campus. Before the Tartars, school nicknames included the Griffins and the Munies. The new name, Warriors, embraced characteristics associated with the WSU student body and athletic teams — a fierce determination and an ability and willingness to compete and succeed. The Warrior name also provides a bridge to the Tartar heritage, thus providing an effective means to retain the loyalty of those who want the Tartar name to live on.

# Irvin D. Reid

Irvin D. Reid was selected as the ninth president of Wayne State University on August 25, 1997, by WSU's eight-member Board of Governors. He comes from New Jersey's Montclair State University where he served as president since 1989.

The new president takes responsibility for the continued growth of one of the nation's leading research universities, with more than 30,000 students, 1,700 full-time faculty, 14 schools and colleges, including law and medicine, and an operating budget of \$329 million.

He is dedicated to the urban university and its roles in the social, cultural, economic and intellectual lives of residents and businesses in the area.

Reid is particularly interested in forming stronger ties with the local business community, and will bring a service-based approach to the university's operations, treating students as customers. That approach was evidenced at Montclair through the creation of an Academic Success Center where students could obtain all the help they needed in one stop.

Reid has a 31-year career as a faculty member and academic administrator. At Montclair, which was previously a state college, he helped the school achieve university status in 1994 based on advancements in its academic programs, facilities and faculty.

Other initiatives he achieved include increasing opportunities for gifted students through the honors program, a global educational program and support of technology and computerization on campus.

Prior to assuming the presidency at Montclair, Reid was a tenured professor at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga. In 1981, he became chairman of the department of marketing and business law, and in 1983 he was appointed dean of the School of Business Administration. As dean, he led the school to reaccreditation of the undergraduate school and initial

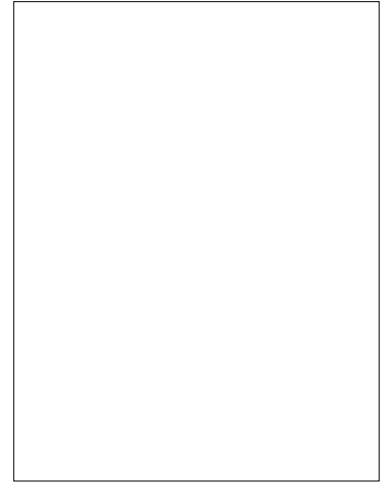
accreditations of the MBA program. The school was recognized in 1987 as one of the top three regional business school by *U.S. News and World Report*.

Reid was associate professor of marketing and business law in the School of Business and Public Administration at Howard University from 1978-79. He was a full-time consultant for the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission in 1977-78.

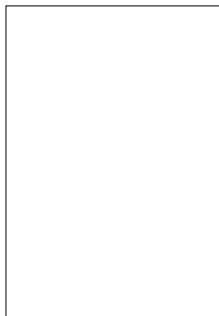
Reid holds bachelor's and master's degrees in general experimental psychology from Howard University as well as a master's degree and a doctorate in business and applied economics from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania.

Reid succeeds David Adamany, who announced his retirement in December 1996, after serving as president since 1982.



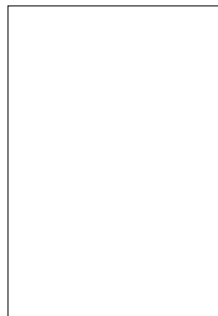

## **Craig Coleman**

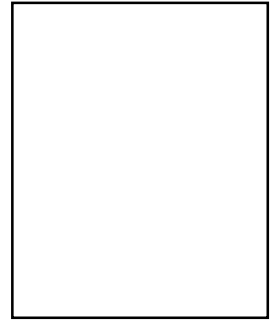
### **Linebacker/Recruiting Coordinator**

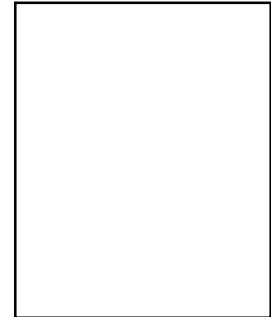


## **Daishawn Franklin**

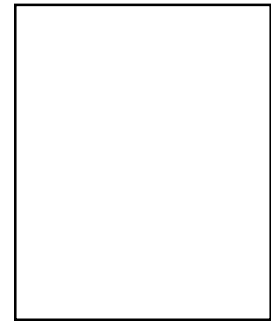
## **Ron Maier**

## **Bob Schroeder**

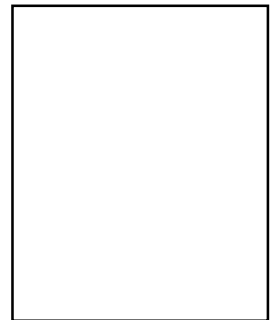
### **Offensive Line**

## Most Net Yards Passing In A Season



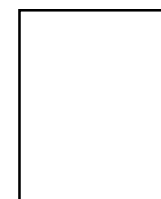

# 2000 Warrior Outlook

“Good things come to those who wait”, is a saying young children have heard from their parents time and time again. Wayne State University hopes that saying holds true for football teams as the Warriors take to the field for the 2000 season.

Change was a big theme for Wayne State in 1999 as a new nickname was selected (Warriors), a new conference was chosen (GLIAC) and many players from Canada took to the field in the green and gold uniforms. The year 2000 has brought change with it as well with the hiring of new head coach Steve Kazor. Kazor will have his work cut out for him as he inherits a team that has not had a winning season since 1994 (6-5) and a team that finished without a win last season (0-11).

Kazor, who came from McPherson College in Kansas and coached in the NFL ranks before coming to Wayne State, feels that the biggest challenge as head coach will not be trying to motivate the players to play, but to get them involved in a new system that they can understand.

“We did have some success in spring football implementing a new system,” said Kazor. “That was my big concern if they could adapt to the new terminology and the new types of offense and defense we were going to run. We were pleasantly surprised at the players adaptability to pick things up. I think that coincides with Wayne State being a strong academic institution which I think is a real positive because it is pretty easy to coach players that are intellectually adept.”

The Warriors return 45 letterman from last season including 10 defensive and nine offensive starters. Kazor knows that lack of talent is not the issue with this team, but possibly bringing out the best in every player to form one single unit, could lead to bigger and better things.

“I really like the players enthusiasm heading into this season,” said Kazor. “We are depending a lot upon our seniors to be our leaders and prepare the rest of the team for what is to come. We have some skilled players that could really help us play at another level.

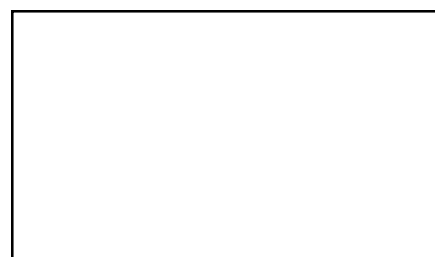
With our new wide open type of offense, I think that will advance our coaching abilities and capabilities and also the players as well. We will be able to throw the ball a lot more which will utilize our weapons at running back and wide receiver.”

The Warriors begin a new chapter in its storied history with an author, Steve Kazor, who wants to win and feels that with hard work and constant preparation Wayne State could get themselves to the top of the GLIAC conference in just a few seasons. With a wide open style of offense and a defense that is all over the field, Wayne State football will no longer be a push over on opponents schedules, but a team that challenges opponents for 48 minutes and brings excitement to WSU Stadium on Saturday afternoons. Below are questions that come to mind as the Warriors take the field in 2000.

## How will the new style of offense effect the quarterback position ?

For the past three seasons the Warriors have primarily been a run oriented team when it came to the offensive side of the ball. This season Steve Kazor will implement a style of offense that will give the quarterback an opportunity to throw the ball a lot more and also have more options on the field. The Warriors are very deep at the quarterback position, but junior **Jason Charron (Clinton Township, Mich.)** is just the man for the job as he heads into his second season behind center. Charron, the starting quarterback from last season, started ten games for the Warriors and passed for 1,329 yards and threw 12 TDs.

“Jason is a guy who has some offensive skills and shows some leadership qualities which is what you need at the quarterback position,” said Kazor.

**Dan Gray (Ontario, Canada)** comes over from Canada and will fight hard for playing time. He was the Canadian “Player of the Year” last season and has picked up things very quickly at Wayne State. He had three touchdown passes in the intrasquad spring game last April. Kazor is most impressed with his mobility for a guy who is 6 foot 5 and weighs 205 pounds.

One guy who has surprised many of the coaches in the spring as well as the summer is returning junior **Rick Baker (Detroit, Mich.)**. Baker played running back and fullback for the Warriors last season. This season he is fighting for time at quarterback and Coach Kazor feels he has the tools to compete.

“Baker didn’t compete in spring ball, but at times he shows signs of being able to take us to another level because of his athletic ability.”

**Kurt Hunsager (Sterling Heights, Mich.)** and **Jabruan Riley (Detroit, Mich.)** will bring additional depth to the quarterback position. Hunsager played in one game for the Warriors last year completing 5 of 10 passes for 86 yards and two touchdowns.

**Kyle Zimmerman (Marine City, Mich.)** played in nine games for the Warriors last season and had the opportunity to start three contests. He threw for 399 yards and two touchdowns.

**Mike Guidici (Boughton, Tex.)** is a junior college transfer from Glendale Junior College in Arizona. He comes out of the same type of system as former Ohio State starting quarterback Joe Germaine.

“He (Guidici) will fit in well with the Warriors considering the system he was in is very similar to what we are going to run.”

## With the new style of offense how will the tailbacks and the fullbacks be utilized ?

Under Barry Fagan the running backs carried the ball 425 times for 1,525 yards and nine touchdowns in 1999. Under Kazor the running backs will have many touches, but many of those touches will be downfield going deep or catching the ball in the flats for screens and flare passes. The backs will run the ball, but many of those carries will be to set up the

pass or to keep the defense honest.

Sophomore **Thabiti Williamson (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** is one guy who could give the Warriors the double threat they need in being able to carry the ball and catch the ball out of the backfield.

Williamson was the Warriors leading rusher last season gaining 513 yards on 104 carries. He scored three touchdowns and rushed for over 100 yards twice. He caught 12 passes for 105 yards averaging 8.8 yards per catch.

Sophomore **Don Slankster (Novi, Mich.)** who was mostly used as a tight end last season played running back for the Warriors during the spring.

"He's a utility guy who can play running back, wide receiver or tight end," said Kazor. "He'd really like the opportunity to focus on one position, but right now we are not exactly sure where we want to use him."

Senior **Brett Warkentien (East China, Mich.)** played in eight games last season and rushed for 440 yards on 91 carries. He also has the ability to catch the ball out of the backfield.

"We signed many freshman and junior college players that will have to help us at the running back position," said Kazor.

## How is the depth at the wide receiver position ?

The Warriors had three receivers last season who caught over 15 passes. This season that number should increase with expanded passing formations and plays.

Junior **Pierre Brown (West Bloomfield, Mich.)** was the Warriors leading receiver last season with 31 catches for 533 yards and nine touchdowns. He will be the starter at "X" receiver position.

**Derek Ginyard (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** a sophomore will be the starter at the split end position. He had 17 catches for 219 yards and one touchdown last season, but

Kazor feels his numbers should increase.

"Ginyard had a really good spring for us," said Kazor. "He's been working very hard increasing his speed."

**Donnie Campbell (River Rouge, Mich.)** and **Morrison Borders (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** each will see significant time at both wide receiver positions. Borders caught 13 passes for 94 yards last season.

"He's (Borders) worked very hard and has really increased his strength in the offseason," said Kazor

Junior **Tim Steele (Sterling Heights, Mich.)** is another receiver who will get a lot of time on the field. He was the second leading receiver last season with 20 catches for 210 yards and two touchdowns.

"Tim didn't have a great spring, but he's the type of guy that will be ready once the season starts," said Kazor. "He's a third down receiver. He's a tall player who has played on winning teams before."

Incoming freshman **Roger White (Sterling Heights, Mich.)** may be a surprise player for the Warriors.

"He has tremendous speed and could help us right away," said Kazor.

**Kamal Jaffar (Dearborn, Mich.)** is a transfer who could really help the receiving corps right away. He's a transfer from Grand Rapids Junior College.

"He's a pleasant surprise and has worked very hard," said Kazor. "He hurt his knee in the summer, but he'll bounce back and do a good job for us."

"We have a lot of young guys and transfers coming in who could also play a big part in our receiving corps," said Kazor. "A lot of things won't be settled or finalized until the fall."

## How will the offensive line fair with only two seniors on the squad ?

The offensive line for Wayne State has great size and numbers, however one thing it is not prolific in is experience.

**Dan Tater (Detroit, Mich.)** and **Aaron Broglin (Allen Park, Mich.)** are the only two seniors on the line taking over the leadership role from Kevin Smith, a second team All-GLIAC selection last season, who was lost to graduation. Both

Broglin and Tater will play significant roles on the line. Broglin is battling **Zach McKee (Chesterfield, Mich.)** at left guard. Tater is slated to be the starter at right guard.

**Kanye Gardner (Grosse Pointe Woods, Mich.)** is expected to be the starter at center while the other two positions of left tackle and right tackle are up for grabs.

"Due to injuries we forced to play a lot of young guys in the spring," said Kazor. "We have numerous amounts of transfers and young players that will battle for our remaining spots."

## What is the deepest position on the team ?

Last season the Warriors did not utilize the tight end as much of a passing threat. However this season with two All-Star caliber tight ends lining up for the Warriors, the offense will have that many more weapons.

"We are really solid at the tight end position," said Kazor. "With **Huston Julian (Roseville, Mich.)** and **Chad Finkbeiner (North Branch, Mich.)** we really think we have two guys that will be scouted by the professionals if they stay healthy."

Julian is a big solid athlete who has great speed for a tight end. Last season he caught five passes for only 87 yards, but averaged 17.4 yards per catch and scored two touchdowns. Finkbeiner is a big thick player who runs good routes and blocks well. He had nine catches for 74 yards as a junior.

**Mike Johnson (Battle Creek, Mich.)**, a sophomore, is a player who adds good depth to the tight ends, but he is trying to bounce back from a broken leg he suffered in the spring.

The Siffin brothers, **Bill Siffin (Sterling Heights, Mich.)** and **Jim Siffin (Sterling Heights, Mich.)** will both battle for playing time at the same position.

"This is our deepest position on the team," said Kazor

## Will the offense as a whole be able to adapt to a new plan of attack ?

“As far as the offense goes we are half way towards where I want us to be,” said Kazor. “We will run a wide open attack that I learned from Tom Moore who was with the Detroit Lions and now runs it for the Indianapolis Colts when I was there. It’s the type of offense that is hard to cover if you have good receivers. Since we have so many, we will be able to run this offense and spread the field. It forces the defense to play man-to-man coverage on our receivers which is what we want.”

“The key to the effectiveness of our offense is the ability for our quarterbacks to be adept, to make audibles and any sort of changes at the line of scrimmage before the ball is snapped,” said Kazor.

## Who will step up and be the kicker for the Warriors ?

The Warriors will try to find the man with the golden toe who will be picked up where Brad Newitt left off from last season. **Ian Fenton (Grosse Pointe, Mich.)**, **Matt Pomeroy (Dearborn, Mich.)** and **Terrance Stonestreet (Detroit, Mich.)** will battle for the kicking position.

“Fenton has looked good in camp so far and is very consistent,” said Kazor. “Pomeroy has a very strong leg and could be a factor and help us. Stonestreet had great success with punting and kicking in high school and is a great athlete.”

## Can the special teams help keep the Warriors in games ?

“I think we will be a lot better on special teams just because we are very deep at the line backer and tight end positions,” said Kazor.

“Our punt team shows the ability to both protect and cover,” said Kazor. “Our speed factor in the kickoff coverage team will be solid because of that factor.”

“Our offensive line has shown its ability to block for our field goal unit and our defensive line gives a great surge on the goal line to hold its own.”

Special teams will get a lot better because of the added emphasis by Kazor. He was the special teams coach for the 1985 Super Bowl Champion Chicago Bears.

## How will the defense be with the loss of many seniors from last season ?

The defense will be led by the large corps of quality linebackers that the Warriors have. In the 4-3 scheme the linebackers will flourish with their ability to stay free and cause havoc in the secondary and stop the run. The Warriors defense is young, but there are many good athletes in many different areas of the field.

## How deep is the linebacker position ?

Like the tight end position, the linebacker positions will be very good battles to see who will be starting. At the right outside line backing position **Chris Cates (Port Huron, Mich.)** will be a big factor on the defense. He had 30 tackles in eight games. He had a game high 14 tackles against Findlay (9/11/99).

“He has some athletic ability as a weakside linebacker to match up with a receiver which is why we put the faster guys at that spot which Cates is,” said Kazor.

**Joe Spuhler (Maccomb, Mich.)** is slated to be the left outside linebacker or the strongside line backer. He had 60 tackles last season including one sack.

“Spuhler has made tremendous gains this summer and looks a lot better,” said Kazor.

**Dave Tatti (Port Huron, Mich.)** is also fighting for that spot. He was the second leading tackler for the Warriors last season with 65. He also had eight tackles for loss and three fumble recoveries.

“Tatti has worked really hard and will see time because he just keeps getting better,” said Kazor

**John Owens (Petal, MS)** played fullback last season and now makes the move to linebacker because of his great strength.

At the starting middle linebacker position, **J.L. Holdsworth (Big Rapids, Mich.)** will battle to take over middle

linebacker position. Holdsworth is a transfer from Ferris State University and is making the switch to linebacker from fullback. He benched 530 pounds last spring and should be ready to make the transition.

**Ed Youngs (Hastings, Mich.)** is a good football player who will fight for the starting middle linebacker position and play on special teams. Youngs had 14 tackles and one sack last season.

**Marvin Beaty (Detroit, Mich.)** is a great athlete who can play any of the linebacker positions.

**Adam Kuehnlein (Monroe, Mich.)** is another good linebacker looking for playing time.

“He played well in the spring game,” said Kazor. “I was very impressed with him because he made some very good plays.”

**Daniel Stuckey (Cummings, GA)** is a junior college transfer who is looking to crack the starting lineup.

“Stuckey impresses me because he can really run,” said Kazor. “He’s going to be a great player.”

## How will the defensive lineman fair with a lot of experienced players coming back from last season.

The defensive tackles have the motto of “getting better and better everyday”. At defensive tackle **Steve Andonovski (Windsor, Ont.)** is a force in the middle. “His situation is that he’s getting better and that he’s played in Canadian football for so long it’s hard for him to get used to the one yard separation between the offensive and defensive lines,” said Kazor. “He’s getting to a point where he can really stagnate the guards a lot better. In spring football he was getting hooked because of that.”

Andonovski, a sophomore, had 13 tackles and two sacks last season.

Junior **Greg Smith (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** is slated to be the starting nose guard this season and is a very hard worker. He had 35 tackles and two forced fumbles last season and should take on a bigger role with the defense.

“If Smith works on his foot speed he could be one of the better players in this league,” said Kazor.

# 2000 Warrior Outlook

The best battle on the team could be between **Dave Donaldson (Marine City, Mich.)** and **Jason Carpenter (Wyandotte, Mich.)** for the starting right defensive end position. Donaldson, a senior, had 19 tackles last season, eight for loss and four sacks. Carpenter, also a senior, had 41 tackles, 13 for loss and led the team with seven quarterback sacks.

“Both guys have really worked hard and a decision will not be made until the season opens,” said Kazor.

Senior **Tim Homrich (Maybee, Mich.)** is the front runner for the starting left defensive end position. Homrich had 37 tackles, 10 for loss and five sacks last season at that position.

“He has a very strong upper body and has good ability and can also run,” said Kazor. “The important thing all of our defensive ends need to do is control the line of scrimmage and rush the passer. We have something many other schools in our conference don’t, which is guys that can control the line of scrimmage and also rush the passer.”

## Will the defensive backfield look different from last season ?

The leading tackler returns from last season in **Jamie Carpenter (Wyandotte, Mich.)** who will play the strong safety position, however the three other positions have not been set in stone yet.

Carpenter, **Sal Warner (Utica, Mich.)** and **Brendan McGlinch (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** will take over the safety positions for the Warriors. Carpenter had 99 tackles and one interception for the Warriors. Warner made 33 tackles last season and one safety.

“When it comes to our cornerbacks and other defensive backs it will be a matter of people being able to play man-to-man coverage and fitting in with our style of play.”

# Steve Kazor - Wayne State Head Coach

Leadership, experience and a winning attitude are three ways to describe first year Warrior head coach, Steve Kazor, who takes over as the 18th head coach in Wayne State history. Kazor has coached at every level from the NFL to the junior college ranks. Under his direction, teams have played at their best and have seen much success in the win column. At Wayne State, Kazor is looking for the same success and effort from his players and coaching staff.

Kazor came to Wayne State after coaching the past two seasons (1998-99) at McPherson College in McPherson, Kansas. He found much success at McPherson College leading an offense to second in the nation in passing for both seasons and averaged 35 points and 465 yards per contest. Kazor's offense was ranked sixth in the nation and his defense was ranked 15th in the country.

Before taking over the reins with the Bulldogs, Kazor was with the NFL Detroit Lions (1994-1997) as he served as an assistant coach working with tight ends and the offensive line. During his tenure in 1994 the Lions led the NFL in kickoff returns and tied the all-time single season record for touchdowns. Kazor helped develop one of the most explosive offenses in the NFL which featured future Hall of Fame running back Barry Sanders. He was directly involved in all pass routes, blocking schemes and attack reads for the offense. He helped coach in playoff games in 1994 and 1995. While Kazor was with the Lions their record was 25-25.

Before dipping back into the NFL ranks, Kazor was head football coach and Associate Athletic Director at Iowa Wesleyan College (1993-1994). Kazor took a program that was 2-9 and guided it to a 9-3 season the following year. His team was ranked seventh in the NAIA final national poll in 1993. Kazor's team outscored opponents 209-59 in the last five games in 1993. He was nominated for National Coach of the Year.

From 1982-1992 Kazor was an assistant coach with the Chicago Bears. His duties included special teams coach, defensive assistant, tight ends coach and assistant to the head coach. In 1985, Kazor coached the special teams in Super Bowl XX in which Chicago defeated the New England Patriots 46-10. He coached in three National Football Conference Championship games and also in two Pro Bowls in Honolulu, Hawaii. While Kazor was with Chicago, the Bears record was 112-60.

Before joining the Bears, Kazor coached another NFC team, the Dallas Cowboys (1981-82). He served as an assistant to the defensive coordinator and helped with the defensive line in training camp. During the offseason, Kazor was involved with the evaluation of college players, the NFL draft and signing players to contracts. While Kazor was with the team, Dallas participated in two NFC title games. His involvement with the Cowboys led to his coaching position with the Bears.

In 1979-1980 Kazor was with the University of Texas at El Paso in El Paso, Texas. He served as linebacker coach and recruiting coordinator. While with Texas El Paso, he instituted a nationwide recruiting network and signed fifteen players. Nine of the fifteen players that Kazor signed ended up signing professional contracts a few years later.

Kazor coached at the University of Texas at Austin from 1976-78 as a secondary assistant. In 1978, the Longhorns were ranked number one in the nation and played in the Cotton Bowl for the National Championship.

In 1976 Kazor was at Southern Utah University in Cedar City, Utah as a defensive coordinator. His defense was ranked 13th in the nation that season. Kazor also taught classes in physical education.

Before heading to Southern Utah, Kazor coached at Colorado State University in Colorado Springs, Colorado. He was a defensive line coach and the recruiting coordinator. During his tenure at Colorado State, Kazor recruited seven college All-Americans from Chicago and Midwest Chicago.

#### What are your recruiting goals ?

If we are able to put a good product on the field, I think we will get a great following from the community and the surrounding areas."

# 1999 Season In Review

## Game 1 - **Wayne State 35 at Mercyhurst College 49**

The Warriors led 7-0 in the first quarter on a 24 yard touchdown pass from Jason Charron to Pierre Brown. The Lakers roared back in the second quarter scoring 21 unanswered points to lead 21-7 at the half. Faheem Williams of Mercyhurst took the opening kickoff of the third quarter 83 yards for a touchdown. Mercyhurst outscored the Warriors 28-14 in the third quarter, but Wayne State rallied and scored 14 points in the fourth. Justin Gibson of the Lakers tied a Mercyhurst record scoring four touchdowns. Warrior punter Brad Newitt broke a Mercyhurst opposition record punting a ball 75 yards. The Lakers and Warriors broke a GLIAC record for the most points in an opening game. Quarterback Jason Charron was 23 of 39 for 285 yards and four touchdowns. He had a long of 80 yards to Pierre Brown. Brown had seven catches for 161 yards and three touchdowns. Jamie Carpenter led the Warriors with eight tackles. Chris Cates had an interception while Ed Youngs and Jim Orth each had sacks.

## Game 2 - **University of Findlay 39 at Wayne State 15**

For the second consecutive contest the Warriors got out of the gate early and led 7-0 at the end of the first quarter. Jason Charron threw a six yard touchdown pass to Pierre Brown to give the Warriors the early lead. However, just like in game one the Warriors fell apart in the second quarter and were down 12-7 at halftime. Wayne State took the lead with 12:09 left in the third quarter on a Charron pass to Derek Ginyard for 35 yards and the score. Wayne State elected to go for two points and converted as Charron found Derrick Thomas for a 15-12 Warrior lead. The Warriors were held scoreless the rest of the way as the Oilers scored 27 consecutive points in the second half to seal the victory. Wayne State allowed 218 yards on the ground and 285 yards in the air for a combined 503 yards. Charron was 15 of 29 for 136 yards and two touchdowns. Wayne State managed only 82 yards on 27 carries. Chris Cates had 14 tackles to lead the Warriors, while Jamie Carpenter added 12 and Sal Warner had 10.

## Game 3 - **Saginaw Valley State 45 at Wayne State 33**

The Warriors never led in the contest as the Cardinals ran out to a 12-0 lead at the end of the first quarter and a 25-14 lead at halftime. What hurt Wayne State the most was the scoreless third quarter as Saginaw increased its lead to 39-14. The Warriors made things interesting in the fourth quarter scoring three consecutive possessions cutting the Saginaw lead to 39-33 with 6:43 left in the fourth quarter. The Cardinals scored one last time to close the game out as quarterback Garrett Small found C. Anderson for a 47 yard touchdown completion. Pierre Brown caught two more touchdown passes giving him a touchdown catch in each of the Warriors three contests. Jason Charron was 17 of 42 for 171 yards and two touchdowns. Derrick Thomas led the Warriors in rushing with 18 carries for 59 yards and two touchdowns. Jamie Carpenter led the Warriors with 11 tackles. Saginaw's Small was 17 of 26 for 365 yards and five touchdowns. Cardinal receiver Brian Dolph had nine catches for 221 yards and two touchdowns including an 89 yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. Marlion Jackson had 32 carries for 184 yards and one touchdown.

## Game 4 - **Wayne State 7 at Ashland University 46**

Wayne State struggled from the beginning and were not able to score until 14:02 left in the fourth quarter. The Warriors turned the ball over six times in the first half and also allowed a safety as Wayne State was down 33-0 at halftime. Wayne State's lone score came on a 27 yard touchdown pass from Jason Charron to Tim Steele. Mike Nowicki led the defense with two interceptions. Terrance Towns led the Warriors with seven tackles. Pierre Brown had seven catches for 84 yards.

## Game 5 - **Wayne State 24 at Northwood University 27**

The Warriors found themselves playing from behind again in the first half as Northwood led 14-10 heading into the locker room. The Warriors scored twice in the second quarter. The first score came on a Ken Kern fumble recovery in the endzone with 2:55 left in the half. Wayne State's second score of the quarter came on a 32 yard field goal by Brad Newitt. Northwood increased its lead in the third quarter on a Sleepie Tollie one yard run, however the Timberwolves missed the extra point. Northwood scored to open the fourth quarter on a 51 yard pass from Tollie to Ron Hunter. Wayne State made a big surge in the fourth quarter behind the leadership of backup quarterback Kurt Hunsager. Hunsager threw touchdown passes of 32 and 29 yards to get the Warriors within three points with 5:23 left in the contest. Wayne State got the ball back with 3:34 left in the contest after stopping the Timberwolves on four downs. The Warriors could not move the ball and Northwood got ball back and ran the clock out. Thabiti Williamson had 28 carries for 169 yards. Derek Ginyard had three catches for 53 yards and Pierre Brown had two catches for 37 yards and one touchdown. Huston Julian also caught a touchdown pass. Mike Nowicki had 17 tackles and one fumble recovery while Jamie Carpenter had 15 tackles and two for loss.

## Game 6 - **Ferris State 62 at Wayne State 20**

The Warriors were held scoreless for the first three quarters while Ferris State led 52-0 at halftime. The Warriors scored on a 14 yard touchdown pass from Jason Charron to Tim Steele and two rushing touchdowns by Thabiti Williamson of 1 yard and 55 yards in the second half. The Bulldogs accumulated 668 total yards (389 passing, 279 rushing). Ferris State had two quarterbacks throw over 100 yards (Kyle Park 148 yards, Matt McCarthy 241 yards). Mo Harris had 13 carries for 151 yards and three touchdowns. C. Coleman had five catches for 162 yards and one touchdown. Thabiti Williamson led the Warriors with 20 carries for 140 yards and two touchdowns. Sal Warner led the defense with 11 tackles and one pass breakup. Jamie Carpenter and Joe Spuhler each had 10 tackles.

# 1999 Season In Review

## Game 7 - **University of Indianapolis 26 at Wayne State 19 (Overtime)**

The biggest heartbreaker of the season for the Warriors as they came back from a 19-9 deficit in the third quarter to tie the contest at 19 with 3:28 left to send the game to overtime. The Warriors on their scoring drive to tie the contest had the ball at the Indianapolis 11 yard line. After a time-out the Warriors opted to kick a field goal. Brad Newitt kicked the 18 yard field goal and the contest went to overtime. In the overtime the Greyhounds got the ball first and scored on a Andy Owen pass to Lance Riegle from 11 yards out. After the successful extra point the Warriors took over at the 25 yard line. After a Thabiti Williamson first down the Warriors were held in check and could not find paydirt as the Greyhounds won in overtime. Both Jason Charron and Kyle Zimmerman threw for 100 yards. Pierre Brown had two catches for 65 yards and one touchdown. Brown's touchdown reception went for 62 yards. Ed Atar had an interception to lead the defense while Tim Homrich added two sacks. Joe Spuhler led the Warriors with eight tackles.

## Game 8 - **Wayne State 9 at Hillsdale College 24**

The Warriors looked strong in the first half scoring on a 10 yard pass from Kyle Zimmerman to Pierre Brown and Brad Newitt kicked a 19 yard field goal to give the Warriors a 9-7 lead. However the offense sputtered and the defense fell apart in the second half as the Chargers scored 17 unanswered points to put the Warriors away. Matt Fisher led the Hillsdale brigade with 21 carries for 93 yards and one touchdown. Jamie Carpenter led the Warrior defense with eight tackles, one for loss, one fumble recovery and one interception. Joe Spuhler had seven tackles, two for loss and one sack. Jason Carpenter and Steve Andonovski each had sacks.

## Game 9 - **Wayne State 10 at Michigan Tech 22**

The Warriors got off to a slow start and were down 15-3 at halftime. Brad Newitt got the Warriors on the board with a 22 yard field goal. Michigan Tech scored in the third quarter and held the Warriors to one touchdown in the contest that was not scored until 7:33 left in the contest. The Warriors lone touchdown came on a 26 yard pass from Jason Charron to Brett Warkentien. The Warriors could not muster up any more offense and fell to the Huskies. The Huskies had two running backs run over 100 yards. Bryan Wedan had 21 carries for 175 yards and two touchdowns and Jeff Dettwiler had 18 carries for 116 yards. Wayne State's Warkentien had 16 carries for 75 yards and three catches for 25 yards and one touchdown. Dave Tatti and Jamie Carpenter led the defense with 11 tackles. Mike Nowicki had 10 had tackles.

# 1999 Season In Review

## Game 10 - Westminster College 24 at Wayne State 14

Westminster jumped out to a 17-7 lead at the end of the first half. The Warriors turned the ball over four times via the interception. The Warriors outgained Westminster 360 to 325. Wayne State scored both touchdowns on two yard runs the first by Thabiti Williamson in the first quarter and the second by Roderick Cooksey. James Graham of the Titans was 19 of 27 for 229 yards and two touchdowns. Marvin Beaty led the defense with 12 tackles.

## Game 11 - St. Joseph College 23 at Wayne State 15

The Puma's headed into the locker room with a 9-0 lead behind the leg of Erich Hitzeman. Hitzeman hit field goals of 47, 52 and a WSU stadium record of 57 yards to pace the Puma's. Derek Ginyard got the WSU fans excited starting the third quarter as returned the opening kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown. St. Joseph's put two more scores on the board in the third quarter. Ricky McCray scored on a 44 yard run from scrimmage and Montell Pace scored on a 53 yard punt return. The Warriors closed the gap to eight on a 26 yard touchdown run by Brett Warkentien, but that is as close as the Warriors would get. Warkentien had 21 carries for 114 yards and one touchdown. Mike Nowicki paced the Warrior defense with 12 tackles with two for loss. This was the first time since 1943 that the Warriors were winless for a season.

## Season Wrap Up

The Warriors finished with a record of 0-11 overall and 0-10 in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. This was the fifth consecutive season in which Wayne State finished with a losing record. This is the first time since the 1989 season the Warriors went winless in the conference.

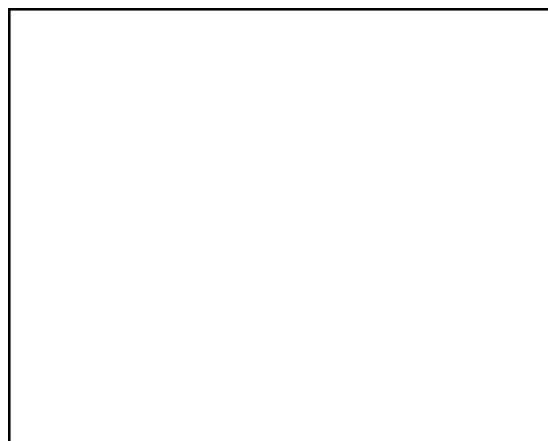

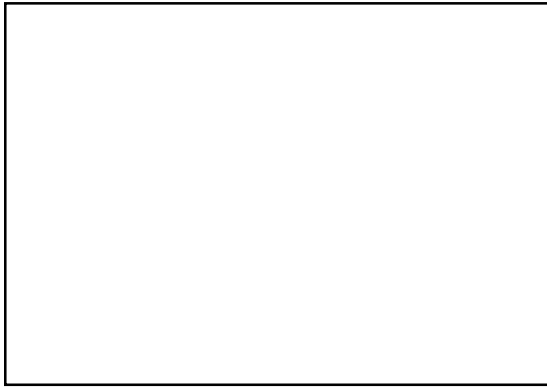

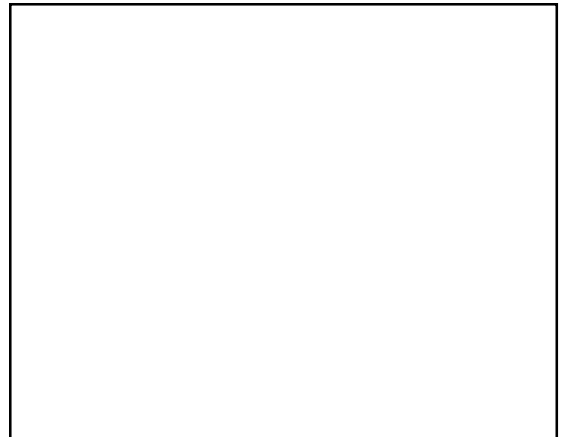


Wayne State offense trying to surge toward the goal line against Ferris State (1994).

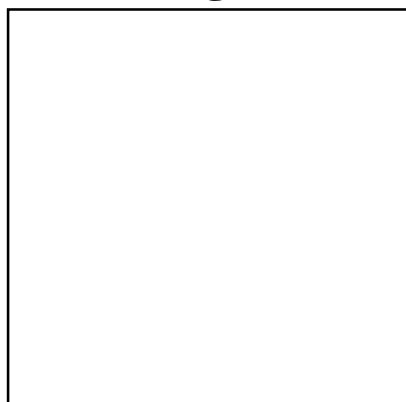

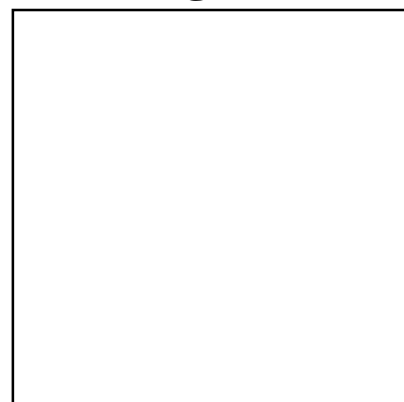

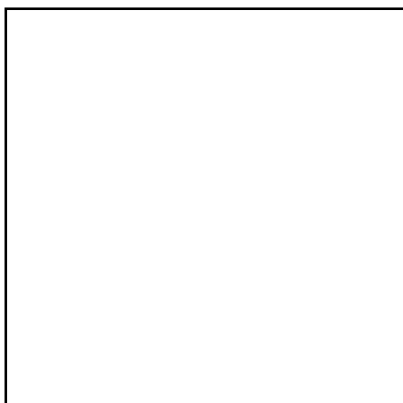

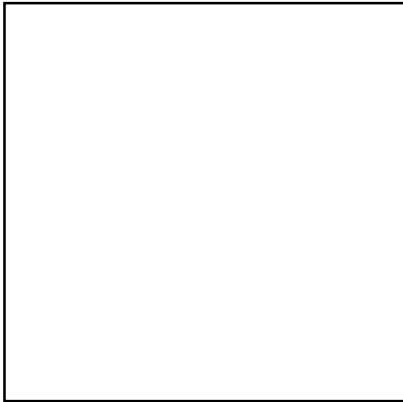

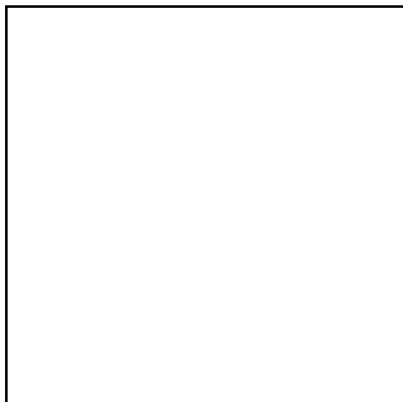

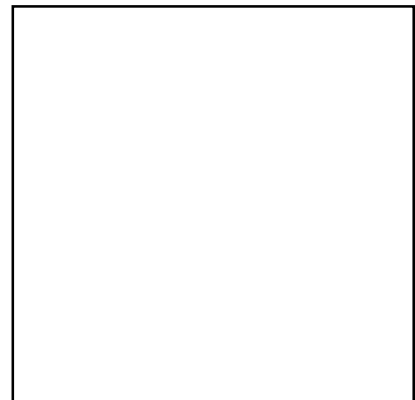

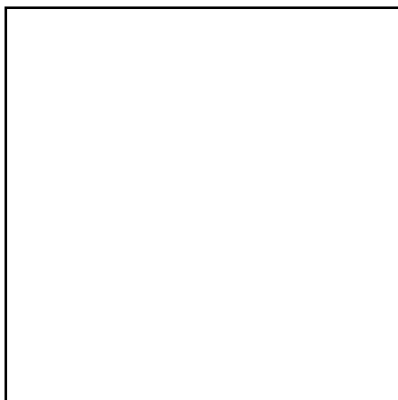
