



# Assistant Coaches



## Wally Chambers Defensive Line Coach

Beginning his first season on the Warrior coaching staff is three-time NFL Pro Bowl selection Wally Chambers.

Prior to Wayne State, Chambers coached at Northern Iowa (1983-84), East Carolina, Temple and Lackawanna Junior College (Scranton, PA), where he served as head coach. He also coached professionally with the New York Jets as defensive line coach and with the World Football League's Ohio Glory.

Chambers was selected the 1973 NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year by *Pro Football Weekly*. He was a first team All-NFC selection for three consecutive seasons (1974-75-76) and a two-time first team All-NFL honoree by the *Newspaper Enterprise Association*. In 1976, UPI selected Chambers as the NFC Defensive MVP.

A native of Phenix City, Alabama, Chambers, 51, played four seasons at Eastern Kentucky before being selected in the first round (8th overall) by the Chicago Bears. He played 88 games between Chicago and Tampa Bay.

## Jim Flasck Defensive Tackles Coach

Entering his third season with Wayne State is assistant coach Jim Flasck.

In addition to his work with the defensive tackles, Flasck also helps with the punters and kickers, as well as serving as football technology coordinator.

He played two seasons at Cornell after graduating from Lake Shore High School in St. Clair Shores. Flasck received a bachelor's degree in engineering from the University of Michigan in 1977, and a master's degree in business administration from Michigan State University's Advanced Management Program in 1987.

Flasck, 47, lives in Rochester Hills, Michigan, with his son Nicholas (22), and three daughters, Rebecca (20), Rachel (18), and Carissa (16).



## Jeremy Gold Defensive Line Coach

Jeremy Gold begins his first season as a member of the Wayne State coaching staff after spending the previous two years as an offensive line graduate assistant coach at Eastern Michigan.

Gold earned four letters as a linebacker at Central Michigan from 1995-98 and completed his bachelor's degree in 1999.

He was a standout high school player at Belleville where he was a first-team All-League performer. He and his twin brother, Jason, both played at CMU while another brother, Ian, played at Michigan, and a third brother, Cory, played at Saginaw Valley.

Born April 15, 1977, in Ypsilanti, Gold is single and resides in Ypsilanti.



## Chris Laidlaw Wide Receivers Coach

Returning for his third season as wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator is Chris Laidlaw.

Before joining the WSU staff, Laidlaw was wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator for Steve Kazor at McPherson College during the 1998 and 1999 seasons.

He served as tight ends and wide receivers coach during 1997 at Moorhead State in Minnesota. The year prior, Laidlaw was running backs coach at Oklahoma Panhandle State.

He was a member of the 1992 and 1993 football squads at Huron University in South Dakota, and also played baseball in 1993.

Laidlaw was born on October 27, 1972, in Pontiac, Michigan, and graduated from Oxford High School in 1991. He received his bachelor's degree in 1997 from Oklahoma Panhandle State and his master's in 1998 from North Dakota State University.

He is married to the former Angela Bisig. They have two children, Charlie (7) and Scarlett (4).



## **Rick Marsack** Tight Ends Coach

Rick Marsack begins his first season as WSU's tight ends coach.

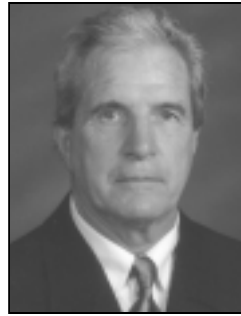
He was a two-year starter on the offensive line for the Warriors (1971-72) while also serving as team captain his senior year.

He received his bachelor's degree in physical education from Wayne State in 1973, and a master's in guidance from WSU in 1980.

A physical education teacher in the Detroit school system for 29 years, Marsack's coaching career began in 1973 as offensive and defensive line coach at Hamtramck High School. After two years at Hamtramck, he coached the offensive line and served as defensive coordinator at Dearborn St. Alphonsus from 1975 to 1979.

He coached five seasons (1980-84) at Centerline St. Clement, and two years (1985-86) at Redford Union (1985-86). From 1987 to 1999, he was the offensive line and defensive coordinator at Riverview Gabriel Richard.

Marsack, 51, currently lives in Livonia with his wife, Christine. They are the parents of two sons, Peter and William.



## **Bob Schroeder** Offensive Line Coach

Bob Schroeder enters his 14th season as a WSU football coach. This will be his third season as the offensive line coach after serving the previous three years (1997-99) as offensive coordinator. He was linebacker coach in 1996.

After graduating with a bachelor's degree from Wayne State in 1966, Schroeder spent one season as a graduate assistant and six years (1967-72) as a full-time assistant coach, the last year as offensive coordinator.

From 1973-86, he was an assistant coach at Grosse Pointe South High School, followed by two seasons as head coach. Schroeder was the head coach for seven seasons (1989-95) at Chippewa Valley High School in Mt. Clemens compiling a 36-27 record.

During his playing days at WSU, he earned three varsity letters (plus a freshman numeral in 1961) and was co-captain as a senior in 1965.

A 1999 inductee into the Michigan High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame, Schroeder was born on April 9, 1943, in Detroit. He and his wife, Carol, reside in St. Clair Shores, and have three grown children.



## **Rod Plummer** Linebackers Coach

Rod Plummer begins his second season at Wayne State in charge of linebackers and special teams.

Prior to joining WSU, Plummer spent the 1999 and 2000 seasons as a graduate assistant coach at Michigan State.

His coaching career began in 1994 as graduate assistant/offensive backfield coach at Kutztown (Pa.) University. After two seasons at Kutztown, he spent the 1996 season as offensive backfield coach at James Madison. Plummer was the offensive backfield coach at Hampton University in 1997 and 1998.

He graduated from Washington State University in 1992 with bachelor's degree in sociology after earning four letters (1988-91) as a linebacker. As a junior, he was second on the team in tackles (90) including five behind the line of scrimmage.

Plummer spent his first two playing seasons at WSU under Dennis Erickson and his final three years for coach Mike Price. As a redshirt freshman in 1999, WSU had a 9-3 record and defeated Houston in the Aloha Bowl.



## **Maury Waugh** Defensive Coordinator

Maury Waugh, a 40-year coaching veteran, enters his first season as WSU's defensive coordinator. He spent the last four seasons (1998-01) as assistant head coach/defensive coordinator and linebacker coach at Western Carolina University. He was an assistant head coach and defensive

line coach in 1997 at WCU.

Waugh was the starting fullback for four years (1958-61) at the University of Dubuque and earned a master's degree in physical education from Indiana in 1966.

Waugh's first collegiate coaching position was at his alma mater, where he served as defensive coordinator for two seasons before spending six seasons (1969-74) as head coach. He then spent five years (1975-79) as head coach at Simpson College in Indianola, Iowa. After spending three seasons at Drake University, Waugh coached at Northwestern University from 1983-91.

After Northwestern, he moved up Lake Michigan to become head coach at Lake Forest College (1992-94). Waugh was the running backs coach at the University of Pacific in 1995 and returned to Illinois after Pacific dropped football. He spent one season as running backs coach at Libertyville High School before joining the WCU staff.

Waugh and his wife, Sandy, are the parents of four sons.



# 2002 Warrior Outlook

Optimism is high in the Wayne State University football camp as the team prepares for the 2002 season. Head coach **Steve Kazor** enters his third season at the Warrior helm, recharged by a solid showing in spring ball, and a number of new assistants on his staff. Kazor and the Warriors feel that the ingredients are in place for a return to the upper echelon of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

Wayne State returns 33 letterwinners including 17 starters from last year's squad which won two road games in the final minutes.

Kazor believes that the success will start on the offensive side of the ball, where the Warriors have nine returning starters.

## OFFENSE

Kazor is excited about the experience of his football squad on both sides of the ball. On offense, the skilled-position players have gone through the rigors of GLIAC football before, and know what it takes to succeed against tough conference opponents week-in and week-out.

"A couple of years ago we played a lot of younger players and experienced some pains, but now these guys are veteran players. The key is for these players to continue to grow, to maximize their abilities and potential.

"I feel like we have the athletes to have a good offensive line especially with fifth-year seniors **Joel Grambau**, **Darrell Czubaj** and **Kevin GoodCourage** returning at center, right tackle and left tackle, respectively."

Juniors **Ryan Strong** and **Shelton Hooks** were listed as the top candidates at the guard slots

following spring ball.

Expected to battle the incumbents for playing time on the offensive line include returnees **Zac McKee**, **Andy Dombrowski**, **Jon Herstein**, **Greg Sims** and **Marvin Beaty**.

Newcomers looking to be included in the mix are **Jaime Farias**, **T.J. Smith**, **Peter Deike** and **Merrick Steele**.

"Injuries decimated our offensive line corps last year. We will be experimenting a lot to find our best combination up front," said Kazor.

Wayne State should be in good shape at quarterback with the return of **Dan Gray** and **Randy Hutchison**, plus the addition of **James Phillips** from College of the Redwoods.

Gray played in eight games last year and led the squad in passing efficiency (102.75), yards (1,735) and touchdown passes (13).

"Dan stepped up this spring but we're anxious to see what gains he makes this summer."

Hutchison saw action in six games and completed a team-best 48.4 percent of his passes.

"Randy did a very fine job coming in and contributing as a true freshman. I believe he has the confidence, and with his experience, a chance to compete for the starting spot."

Phillips received all-region honors after throwing for nearly 2,600 yards.

No matter who takes the snaps for the Warriors, he will have no shortage of capable running backs to hand the ball of to.

Junior **Jorge Gomez** was second on the squad in rushing yards in 2001, while classmate **Pat Harwood** led the team in rushing touchdowns. Both will be pushed for playing time by junior college

transfer **Craig Duppong**. He led Joliet to a 10-1 record with 1,310 rushing yards on his way to being named conference player-of-the-year.

Wayne State also returns wing **Nate Collins**, who is the team's top-returning receiver plus was the Warriors' top rusher last season.

Many players have been waiting in the wings behind Pierre Brown, who signed a free agent contract with the Detroit Lions.

Junior **Roger White** had 15 receptions last year, while sophomore **Marqus Anthony** had two touchdowns on only 11 receptions as a true freshman.

Reserves **Greg Luvisotto**, **Michael Griffie** and **Lynn Morton** should provide additional speed and depth at the wideout positions.

"Finding a replacement for Pierre Brown will be a big task for us, but we have several fine young receivers that hopefully will step up and give us the corps that we need to produce big numbers."

Redshirt junior **Mike Johnson** will battle transfer **Sam Anderson** (Eastern Michigan) for the starting tight end spot. Freshmen **Michael MacDonagh** and **Chris Smilo** are looking for playing time.

"For us, the tight end spot is really three positions – a receiver, a running back and an offensive lineman. This is why we may rotate several players for specific situations this season."

## DEFENSE

After allowing nearly 200 yards a game rushing in 2001, Wayne State should be much improved defensively with the addition of defensive coordinator Maury Waugh.

Senior **Steve Andonovski** and redshirt freshman **Leo Wells**

anchor the defensive end slots, while juniors **Craig Jobe** and **Julius Haynes** are scheduled to be the starting defensive tackles.

Battling for playing time on the defensive line will be **Jaron Blueford**, **John Trudel**, **Andy Thomas** and **Albert Taliaferro**. Newcomers looking to make an immediate impact are **Martez Moore** and **Godwin Ihentuge**.

"We tried to go out and find a few transfers to fill spots in the defensive line. Our spring showed much improvement in the defensive line as our entire defense had."

The linebacking corps will be led by sophomores **Mohamad Bazzi** and **Mike Macek**, along with senior **Shaun Holiday**. Battling the top unit for playing time will be seniors **Daniel Stuckey**, **Adam Kuehnlein**, and **Frank Hess** and junior **Nick Pappas**.

Incoming freshmen **Fred Harbor**, **Michael Hall** and **Douglas Ducat** will look to make an impact on special teams and in a reserve role.

"We feel our linebacker corps may be the strength of our team. We return size, strength and speed that are needed to compete at this level."

Wayne State's defensive backfield will be young at the corners and experienced at the safeties.

Sophomores **Earl Carruthers** and **Alvin Mask** finished spring ball on the No. 1 unit and will be backed-up by **Aaron Hannah**, **Ryan Rutley** and newcomers **Alphonso Clark** and **Jerrard Humes**.

Fifth-year seniors **Derrick Thomas** and **Qasim Basir** are the top safeties and will have **Nick Hall** and **Derek Ginyard**, along with

freshmen **Aaron Reid** and **Jerell Batson** as their understudies.

"Last year Earl and Alvin were thrust into our secondary as true freshmen. They have matured and are ready. Our battles at the safety spots will be very competitive."

### SPECIAL TEAMS

Place-kicker Stephen Wayne returns for his sophomore season after connecting on four field goals in his rookie season, including a long of 35-yards at Findlay.

Junior Adam Nemer-Kaiser handled the punting duties in 2001 and averaged 35.5 yards per boot.

"We need to improve on special teams individually and the teams collectively. Our punters and kickers must get better and the surrounding casts will then respond."

### THE SCHEDULE

The Warriors will play their lone non-league contest at Northern Iowa for the second straight season. WSU will play the Panthers in Cedar Falls, Iowa, on Thursday, Aug. 29.

The remaining 10 games are against GLIAC competition.

Wayne State will open the home portion of its schedule September

21 against Grand Valley State. The Lakers went 13-1 last year and reached the NCAA Division II Championship game.

Also visiting WSU Stadium will be Ashland, who tied for fifth in the 12-team GLIAC last year, and Northern Michigan, who will be this year's Homecoming opponent. The final two home games are versus Mercyhurst and Saginaw Valley State. The Cardinals went 9-1 in the league last year.

Besides facing Kurt Warner's alma mater (Northern Iowa), the Warriors have five conference road games. WSU begins league play at Findlay, and also travels to Ferris State, Hillsdale, Michigan Tech and Northwood.

### THE GLIAC

As always, the GLIAC race shapes up to be as competitive as ever. Kazor sees Grand Valley as the frontrunner again in 2002.

"Grand Valley has got to be the team to beat. They won the GLIAC last year."

### FINAL THOUGHTS

Kazor lists several factors as instrumental to the success of his team in 2002.

Taking care of the ball will be one key factor on offense. The Warriors had 40 turnovers last season, while recording 20 takeaways.

Defensively, Wayne State allowed over four yards a carry by its opponents in 2001, and opposing quarterbacks had three times as many touchdown passes as interceptions.

"We need to stay healthy. We are still building and have some good players but we don't have the depth yet. We will be better on defense, and offensively our quarterbacks must have a better touchdown/interception ratio."
