WSU adopts new athletic identity

Wayne State University, by recommendation of an universitywide task force, has adopted a new athletic identity system. The new system replaces a limited and dated identification system and introduces the Warrior team name and mascot.

The previous name, Tartar, first appeared in 1927 after a contest held on the then City College campus. Before the Tartars, school nicknames included the Griffins and the Munies. The new name, Warriors, embraced characteristics associated with the WSU student body and athletic teams — a fierce determination and an ability and willingness to compete and succeed. The Warrior name also provides a bridge to the Tartar heritage, thus providing an effective means to retain the loyalty of those who want the Tartar name to live on.

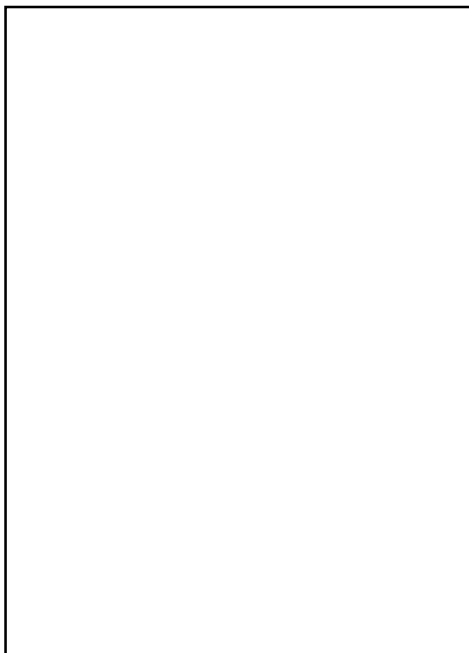
2000-2001 WSU Hockey Outlook

Now that the first year of bumps and bruises are over for the newly formed Wayne State University women's hockey team, the Warriors can begin their second season with the first year jitters behind them. For the 2000-2001 season, Wayne State return nine letterwinners while adding 15 newcomers to this year's squad. "We're still in our infancy regarding this hockey program," notes second year head coach Tom O'Malley. "However, we'll be much more competitive this season and hopefully defeat some of the teams that beat us last year. We'll still have our hands full with the traditional teams, which have been in existence for more than five years, but I'm looking forward to coaching against them and showing our best."

With the blend of the Warriors' highly rated veterans and incoming players, Coach O'Malley states that this year's team will be strong in all three positions. "We have a solid group of players this year. We might not win every game, but we'll definitely have a fighting chance. Last year we had a small team and we were inexperienced, but I'm still proud of the season we had last year. We fought hard and improved with every game. This year we'll take it another step and win some games and close the gap in others." In goal, freshman Anna VanderMarliene (St. Clair Shores, Mich./Lakeshore) comes to Wayne State after being one of the most highly recruited goaltenders in midget hockey. VanderMarliene was the MVP of the midget National Championship and led her midget team (Belle Tire) to the National Championship title. Returning to see time in goal are sophomore

Stacey Bowden (Windsor, Ontario) and senior Laura Tash (Warren, Mich./Cousino). Bowden saw time in goal in 15 of 21 games last season and finished the year with 479 saves and a .839 saves percentage. Tash played in ten games last year, including the last five, and recorded 208 saves.

At the forward position, sophomores Amy Peters, Kelly Pike and Serena Hillman return for their second season. Peters (Grosse Pointe, Mich./University Liggett) finished last season with eight total points (five goals, three assists) and played in all 21 games. Pike (Ottawa, Ontario) saw action in all 21 games and finished with four points (one goal, three assists). Hillman (Delta, British Columbia) returns as the Warriors leading scorer from last year after recording three goals and

eight assists for 11 points. Also looking to see time on the ice at the forward position will be returnee sophomore Jamie Herod (Fraser,

Mich./Fraser) along with freshmen Lindsey Akers (Lincoln Park, Mich./Lincoln Park), Katie Jones (Burnaby, British Columbia), Maria Sawchuk (Whitelake, Mich./Lakeland), Laurie Petchar (Saline, Mich./Saline), Kim Spaulding (Farmington Hills, Mich./Harrison) and Annie Devaney (Detroit, Mich./Cass Tech). Aikers, Sawchuk, Petchar, Spaulding and Devaney come from the highly touted midget teams of Belle Tire and Honeybaked and all can contribute on the ice immediately.

Defensively there will be plenty of healthy competition as the Warriors return junior Dawn Quinn (Essex, Ontario) and sophomore Kristina Sanfilippo (Trenton, Mich./Trenton). Both are solid players and will help guide the incoming players. Looking to see the ice for the first time as Warriors are Joanie Denby (Sterling Heights, Mich./Warren Mott), Melissa Wenzel (Canton, Mich./Plymouth Canton), and Kelly Meech (Coquitlam, British Columbia). Denby and Wenzel both come from the midget national championship Belle Tire team and will be counted on heavily this season. Meech is a strong, fiery player who sees the ice well.

This year's schedule for the Warriors' will definitely be tougher as they play more college hockey powerhouses in Yale, Princeton and Providence College. "I'm looking forward to this year's schedule," notes Coach O'Malley. "This year we'll have a team that will provide plenty of competition and all of our games will be competitive."

Tom O'Malley **Head Coach**



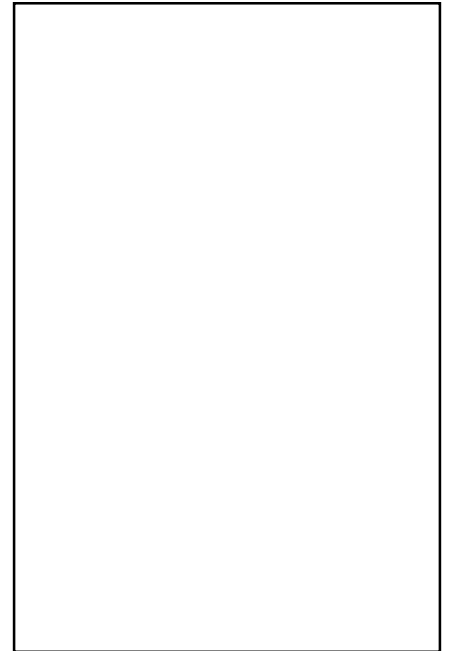
With 16 years experience behind him, Tom O'Malley will begin his second season as Wayne State University's women's hockey team.

In October of 1999, the Warriors began its NCAA Division I women's hockey program and brought the prestige of being the only NCAA Division I women's program in the state of Michigan. In the Warriors' inaugural season, Wayne State finished with a 11-0 record versus non NCAA schools and a 0-21 record versus NCAA opponents. O'Malley currently posts a 137-198-28 overall record within his 15 years of coaching.

O'Malley, who was hired in May 1999, comes to Wayne State after coaching for 15 years at Boston College. O'Malley guided Boston College's women's hockey program from the ground up in the 1980's and was also named the head coach as the university raised the team's status to Division I. He is proud of the fact that while at Boston College he won two AWHCA National Championship (1992 & 1993) and numerous other tournaments.

O'Malley started at Boston College as an assistant coach and took over the head coaching position in 1984. As the leader of the program, O'Malley amassed the highest win total in team history. Besides handling all the team's day-to-day operation, including practices and games, O'Malley provided guidance and direction through all the team's academic and athletic activities including scheduling, equipment inventory and maintenance, recruiting and travel, and even driving the zamboni.

O'Malley graduated from Boston College with a bachelor's degree in economics from the College of Arts and Sciences, after graduating from Don Bosco Technical High School in Boston. He also played collegiate hockey at Boston College. O'Malley, 37, is single and resides in Farmington Hills, Michigan.

Joining the coaching staff for her second year is assistant coach Heather DeRath. DeRath joins the staff after serving as head coach of the Kent State Mid-Am Development Camp. Her duties included developing practice plans for teams of 21 girls ages 13-15 and supervising off-ice activities. She also served as the head coach of the U.S. Olympic Development Camp tryouts in the state of Michigan where she designed and coached two weekend tryouts for over 200 players.

DeRath played youth hockey in Detroit and was a member of the first women's team from Michigan to win nationals (Little Caesar's). She attended three consecutive Olympic Development camps and continued on to play at the collegiate level at Cornell University. While completing her bachelor of science degree in business management and marketing from Cornell University (1998), DeRath worked as a sports

marketing intern and as an office assistant in the football office.

DeRath's other experience stems from being appointed the Hockey Director and Marketing Director of ARC IceSports. Her hockey responsibilities included creating and monitoring budgets for all the hockey leagues, while also founding and supervising a youth hockey league for over 500 participants. DeRath, 24, married Brian DeRath this past summer and they reside in Northville, Michigan.

The President and University

Irvin D. Reid

Dr. Irvin D. Reid was selected as the ninth president of Wayne State University on August 25, 1997, by WSU's eight-member Board of Governors. He comes from New Jersey's Montclair State University where he served as president since 1989.

The new president takes responsibility for the continued growth of one of the nation's leading research universities, with more than 30,000 students, 1,700 full-time faculty, 14 schools and colleges, including law and medicine, and an operating budget of \$329 million.

He is dedicated to the urban university and its roles in the social, cultural, economic and intellectual lives of residents and businesses in the area.

Reid is particularly interested in forming stronger ties with the local business community, and will bring a service-based approach to the university's operations, treating students as customers. That approach was evidenced at Montclair through the creation of an Academic Success Center where students could obtain all the help they needed in one stop.

Reid has a 31-year career as a faculty member and academic administrator. At Montclair, which was previously a state college, he helped the school achieve university status in 1994 based on advancements in its academic programs, facilities and faculty.

Other initiatives he achieved include increasing opportunities for gifted students through the honors program, a global educational program and support of technology and computerization on campus.

Prior to assuming the presidency at Montclair, Reid was a tenured professor at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga. In 1981, he became chairman of the department of marketing and business law, and in 1983 he was appointed dean of the School

of Business Administration. As dean, he led the school to re-accreditation of the undergraduate school and initial accreditation of the MBA program. The school was recognized in 1987 as one of the top three regional business schools by *U.S. News and World Report*.

Reid was associate professor of marketing and business law in the School of Business and Public Administration at Howard University

from 1978-79. He was a full-time consultant for the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission in 1977-78.

Reid holds bachelor's and master's degrees in general experimental psychology from Howard University as well as a master's degree and a doctorate in business and applied economics from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania.

He is married to Dr. Pamela Trotman Reid, visiting professor of Psychology and Research Scientist at the University of Michigan. Their two children are Nicole Reid Gore, attorney, and I. Dexter Reid, software engineer.

Reid succeeds David Adamany, who announced his retirement in December, 1996, after serving as president since 1982.

The University

Wayne State University has progressed from a small, private medical college founded in 1868 to a national research university made up of 14 schools and colleges - including one of the largest single campus medical schools in the United States.

As it began its second century a few years back, WSU was cited by the prestigious Carnegie Commission on Higher Education with the following summary: "Few universities have seen and met the challenges presented by urban problems as Wayne State University has."

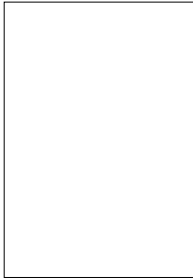
The University enrolls about 30,000 students each fall, 98 percent of whom live off campus and commute to Wayne State's campus in the heart of the University Cultural Center. The Wayne State student has a median age of 28.8 years and 98 percent of the student body remains employed while attending school.

Consistent with its urban setting, WSU stands as an avenue of opportunity to a first-class university for the low income and minority youth in the metropolitan Detroit area. Except for a few of the historically black institutions, many of them in the South, WSU enrolls the largest number of minority students of any state university in the nation. Nearly twenty-one percent of WSU's students are black, while over 14 percent are from other minority groups.

Besides the School of Medicine, WSU offers comprehensive programs in 13 schools and colleges: Business Administration, Education, Engineering, Fine, Performing and Communication Arts, Graduate School, Law, Liberal Arts, Lifelong Learning, Nursing, Pharmacy and Allied Health Professions, Science, Social Work, and Urban, Labor and Metropolitan Affairs. Though it is a university of the city, WSU has transformed its surroundings over the last decade from a collection of buildings intersected by concrete and blacktop streets into a more traditional college campus. An ambitious and ongoing beautification program has meant the greening of the campus, with lawns, trees and malls replacing many of the roads now closed at the entrance to center.

The University has matured during its 131 years; it now offers comprehensive programs of graduate and undergraduate study at a campus that offers the vitality of city life in a setting which also offers for quiet contemplation and study.
